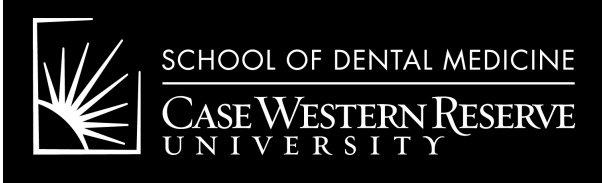

Patients with chronic head and neck pain pose a challenge to treating clinicians. Understanding of the neuroanatomy of pain, physiology and personal burden of chronic pain, is paramount to address multiple phenotypes and overlapping diagnoses. Close collaboration across disciplines to manage these conditions requires communication, nimbleness, and the ability to recognize the importance of a team approach.
